JOINT MOTION REGARDING PROPOSED BRIEFING SCHEDULE

Plaintiffs in this action, a putative class of Kentucky Medicaid beneficiaries, assert claims under the APA, 5 U.S.C. § 706(2), and Take Care Clause of the U.S. Constitution, Art. II, § 3, cl. 5, seeking declaratory and injunctive relief pertaining to actions taken by federal government officials pursuant to Section 1115 of the Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. § 1315. Plaintiffs challenge (1) the Secretary of Health and Human Services' issuance of a guidance document concerning states' imposition of work requirements on Medicaid recipients and; (2) the Secretary's decision to waive certain requirements of the Medicaid program and approve the Commonwealth of Kentucky's demonstration project known as "Kentucky HEALTH," certain components of which the Commonwealth plans to begin implementing on July 1, 2018.

The Government has filed a motion to transfer this case to the Eastern District of Kentucky. ECF No. 6. Plaintiffs opposed the Government's motion to transfer, ECF No. 15, and the Government replied, ECF No. 25. Although the Government continues to maintain that this action should be properly brought in the Eastern District of Kentucky, the Government has acceded to Plaintiffs' request to expedite the certification of the administrative record, and it delivered the administrative record to plaintiffs on March 6, 2018. Without prejudice to the pending motion to

transfer, the Government agrees to the following schedule so as to facilitate Plaintiffs' asserted need for resolution of the issues in advance of July 1, 2018. The Government continues to maintain that this case should be transferred to the Eastern District of Kentucky, where a similar briefing schedule could be entered so as to permit the transferee court to resolve the dispute prior to July 1, 2018.

The parties have conferred and respectfully move this Court to enter the following briefing schedule, which would allow for the parties' motions on the merits of this case to be ripe for decision well in advance of July 1, 2018:

March 30: Plaintiffs' Motion for Preliminary Injunction and/or Motion for Summary

Judgment

April 25: Government's Opposition to Plaintiffs' Motion(s) and Government's

Motion to Dismiss and/or Motion for Summary Judgment

May 14: Plaintiffs' Opposition to Government's Motion(s) and Plaintiffs' Reply in

Support of Their Motion(s)

May 24: Government's Reply in Support of its Motion(s)

The parties agree to stay Defendants' obligation to Answer the Complaint until resolution of these motions.

The parties are discussing how to deal with class issues in this case and will follow up with the Court regarding when and how to deal with them in the most efficient manner. Dated: March 8, 2018
