#### PLAINTIFFS' RESPONSE TO EMERGENCY MOTION TO STRIKE

In his emergency motion to strike Plaintiffs' response to his motion to intervene (Doc. 12), Intervenor Stephen P. Wallace alleges that he did not receive a copy of Plaintiffs' response brief (Doc. 11). He also contends that Plaintiffs committed fraud

on the Court by representing that they served the response via certified mail. Doc. 12 at 2.

As Plaintiffs explained in their Notice of Service to the Court (Doc. 13), Wallace was served with the response on March 29, 2018. Doc. 13-1. Plaintiffs mailed the response on March 22, 2018, Doc. 11 at 5, and Wallace filed his motion on March 28, 2018, one day before he received the response. *See* Doc. 12. Wallace's motion offers no other reason that Plaintiffs' response to his motion to intervene should be stricken. Accordingly, the Court should deny his emergency motion to strike Plaintiffs' response and, for the reasons stated in Plaintiffs' response, deny his motion to intervene.
