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Pursuant to Rule 12(b)(1), Rule 12(b)(6), and Rule 56 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, and this Court's July 16, 2019 Order, Defendants move to dismiss Plaintiffs' complaints in these related cases or, in the alternative, move for summary judgment. Although Defendants do not believe it is necessary for the Court to rule on Plaintiffs' pending motions for a preliminary injunction, Defendants also oppose those motions.

Included with this motion are Defendants' memorandum of law, the portions of the administrative record cited therein (excluding citations to the Federal Register), and a proposed order. Because this case arises under the Administrative Procdure Act (APA), Defendants have not included a Rule 56.1 Statement of Undisputed Material Facts. *See Glara Fashion, Inc. v. Holder*, No. 11 Civ. 889(PAE), 2012 WL 352309, at \*1 n.1 (S.D.N.Y. Feb. 3, 2012) ("Because this case arises under the APA, the Court's decision is based on the administrative record.

Accordingly, no Rule 56.1 Statement was required to be submitted by the parties." (citations omitted)).
