JOINT STATUS REPORT

By Order dated October 30, 2019, ECF No. 73, the Court directed Plaintiffs and Defendants to submit a Joint Status Report proposing a deadline for filing an amended complaint, a briefing schedule and page limits for Defendants' motion to dismiss, and a deadline for the production of the administrative record.

Defendants have advised Plaintiffs that they intend to seek the Court's leave to file a motion to stay the proceedings in this Court pending the Fourth Circuit's resolution of the appeal of the preliminary injunction issued by this Court. If the Court is amenable to Defendants' request, the parties propose the following schedule:

- Defendants will produce the administrative record by November 25, 2019.
- Defendants will file their motion to stay proceedings in this Court by November 26, 2019.
 - Plaintiffs will file their opposition to the motion to stay proceedings by December 13, 2019.
 - Defendants will file any reply in support of their motion to stay proceedings by

December 20, 2019.

- Plaintiffs will file their Second Amended Complaint by December 20, 2019.
- If the Court denies the Defendants' motion to stay proceedings, Defendants will file their motion to dismiss within 21 of the date of such denial or January 22, 2019, whichever is later. The motion to dismiss will be limited to 25 pages, but Defendants may seek additional pages if necessary in light of the changes made in the Second Amended Complaint.
 - Plaintiffs will file their opposition to the motion to dismiss 21 days after Defendants file their motion to dismiss. The opposition will have the same page limit as the motion to dismiss.
 - Defendants will file their reply in support of their motion to dismiss 14 days after Plaintiffs file their opposition.¹ The reply will be limited to 12 pages or half of the length of the moving brief, whichever is greater.
