On December 16, 2019, the Commonwealth notified the Department of Health and Human Services, Centers for Medicaid and Medicare Services of the termination of its section 1115

demonstration project entitled "Kentucky Helping to Engage and Achieve Long Term Health" (KY HEALTH) (Project Number 11-W-00306/4 and 21-W-00067/4) that the Centers for Medicaid & Medicare Services (CMS) approved on January 12, 2018, and the Kentucky HEALTH program that the Centers for Medicaid & Medicare Services approved on November 20, 2018 as a component the previously-referenced demonstration project. (*See* Letter to CMS, Dec. 16, 2019, attached as Exhibit A).

The Commonwealth having terminated the section 1115 demonstration project that is the sole issue of the above-styled appeals, the appeals are moot and should be dismissed, with prejudice. The voluntary dismissal of the above-styled appeals will not affect any other appeal before this Court, including *Charles Gresham*, et al. v. Alex M. Azar II, et al., Nos. 19-5904 and 19-5096.

Further, counsel for Plaintiffs-Appellees and counsel for the Commonwealth agree to resolve the assessment of costs and attorney's fees through extrajudicial means.

Wherefore, the Intervenor-Defendant-Appellant Commonwealth of Kentucky moves for the voluntary dismissal of the above-styled appeals, with prejudice.
