Dear Ms. Wolfe:

The government's motion for a stay of the district court's injunction pending appeal, filed November 15, 2019, is fully briefed. We are writing to inform the Court that the Fourth Circuit has granted the government's motion for a stay pending appeal of a nationwide injunction issued by a district court in Maryland against the same Rule. The Fourth Circuit's order is attached.

The Fourth Circuit now joins the Ninth Circuit in entering a stay of district court orders preliminarily enjoining implementation of the Rule. This Court should do the same. At a minimum, the Fourth and Ninth Circuit's rulings highlight the inequity inherent in the issuance of an injunction that extends beyond what is necessary to redress the plaintiffs' alleged injuries. The injunction at issue in this case continues to govern within the Ninth and Fourth Circuits, even though both courts have concluded that the Rule should be permitted to take effect.
