

JUDGMENT

On December 23, 2020, the undersigned District Judge entered an order that GRANTED the federal defendants' Motion to Dismiss as to Plaintiffs Leal and Von Dohlen and DENIED IN PART as to Plaintiff Armstrong. Plaintiffs Leal and Von Dohlen's claims against the federal defendants were DISMISSED WITH PREJUDICE. Plaintiff Armstrong's nondelegation claim was DISMISSED WITH PREJUDICE. In the same order, the undersigned GRANTED the state defendants' Motion to Dismiss. Plaintiffs' state-law claims against the state defendants were DISMISSED WITHOUT PREJUDICE.

On March 25, 2021, the parties stipulated pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(a)(1)(A)(ii) to the dismissal with prejudice of Plaintiff Armstrong's sole remaining claim. Accordingly, there are no remaining claims in this case.¹

Therefore, Plaintiffs Victor Leal, Patrick Von Dohlen, and Kim Armstrong's claims against Defendants Xavier Becerra, Janet Yellen, Marty Walsh, and the United States of America are DISMISSED with prejudice.




¹ Accordingly, ECF Nos. 26 and 30 are terminated as moot.

Plaintiffs Victor Leal and Patrick Von Dohlen's claims against Defendants Doug Slape and the Texas Department of Insurance is DISMISSED without prejudice for lack of subject-matter jurisdiction.
