JOINT MOTION TO CONTINUE STAY

Plaintiff-Appellee Local Initiative Health Authority for Los Angeles County, dba L.A. Care Health Plan, and Defendant-Appellant United States hereby jointly move to continue the stay of these appeals for 60 days from the date of the Court's order.

On December 17, 2020, this Court stayed these appeals pending the disposition of any petitions for certiorari in the Related Cases or the expiration of the time to seek certiorari if no such petitions were filed. The Court further directed that, within 14 days of the denial of any such petitions or the expiration of the time to file such petitions, the parties inform the Court how to proceed in these appeals.

On February 19, 2021, the *Maine* and *Community Health Choice* plaintiffs jointly filed a petition for writ of certiorari to the U.S. Supreme Court. *See* Pet. for Writ of Certiorari, *Maine Cmty. Health Options v. United States* (No. 20-1162). On April 9, 2021,

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the United States filed a conditional cross-petition for a writ of certiorari. See Pet. for Writ of Certiorari, United States v. Maine Cmty. Health Options (No. 20-1432). On February 24, 2021, Common Ground also filed a petition for writ of certiorari to the U.S. Supreme Court seeking review of the Federal Circuit's judgment. See Pet. for Writ of Certiorari, Common Ground Healthcare Co-Op v. United States (No. 20-1200). The Government filed a conditional cross-petition on April 30, 2021. See Pet. for Writ of Certiorari, United States v. Common Ground Healthcare Co-op (No. 20-1536).

On June 28, 2021, the U.S. Supreme Court denied all petitions and cross-petitions for certiorari filed in the above cases. Since then, the parties have initiated discussions to determine whether they could agree to engage in a process to reach a negotiated, final resolution of some or all of these cases, which seek recovery of Cost Share Reduction amounts owed by the government for benefit years 2018 and beyond. To facilitate these discussions, the parties jointly request that this Court continue the stay for 60 days from the date of its order to allow additional time to resolve some or all of the pending claims without further litigation on the measure of damages.
