### UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR LEAVE TO AMEND COMPLAINT

Plaintiffs the State of Texas and the Texas Health and Human Services Commission move for leave to amend their complaint. Their proposed First Amended Complaint is attached. The Court's leave is necessary because it is more than 21 days since the Defendants filed their motion to dismiss. Fed. R. Civ. P. 15(a)(2). The Defendants do not oppose this motion.

There is good cause to permit this amendment. As the Court observed at the preliminary-injunction hearing, the facts and circumstances have changed since the case was filed; the amended complaint concerns claims that could not have initially been brought because they arose after Texas first sued. The amended complaint involves the same parties and the same subjects as the original complaint; it will not fundamentally change the character of the case or require the addition of new parties.

The amendment will not delay the case, and as demonstrated by their non-opposition to this motion, the Defendants will not be prejudiced by the amendment.

For these reasons, Plaintiffs pray that the Court grant them leave to amend their complaint as shown in the proposed First Amendment Complaint.
