For the following reasons, the federal government respectfully requests a 63-day extension of time, to and including February 1, 2022, in which to file its opening brief. This motion is unopposed.

- 1. The federal government's opening brief is currently due on November 30, 2021. The federal government previously received extensions totaling 90 days for this brief.
- 2. The federal government respectfully requests an additional 63-day extension of time in which to file its opening brief. The additional extension is expected to make this appeal unnecessary. This is an appeal from a preliminary injunction that barred the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) from enforcing its Conditional Sailing Order (and related guidance) against cruise ships arriving at, within, or departing from a Florida port. By its terms, the CDC Order is due to expire on January 15, 2022, and then transition into a voluntary program, which should make this appeal unnecessary.
