Please consider this correspondence under FRAP 28(j) in the above-entitled matters.

In response to the Government's arguments about all unvaccinated personnel facing mandatory retention boards, we reference DoDI 6490.07, and specifically ¶4a (commander's discretion on medical readiness), ¶4b (ability to obtain assessments and waiver of medical conditions to deploy); ¶4c (waiver of medical conditions for deployment); ¶4d (after medical assessment, remain deployable, disqualifying conditions notwithstanding); Enclosure 2 (medical assessment), Enclosure 3 (waivers).

In response to the Government's arguments about religious exemptions allegedly being permanent, we reference AFI 52-201,² and specifically ¶ 5.7.2 ("... However, there may be a change in circumstances that requires the accommodation to be reevaluated in the future (e.g., deployment, new duties, or other material change in circumstances).") and ¶ 5.7.4 ("Approved accommodations will continue unless the member's commander determines a compelling government interest exists requiring a temporary or permanent withdrawal of the approval.").

Likewise, in response to the Government's arguments about religious exemptions allegedly being permanent, DoDI 1300.17, ¶3.2(g), a relevant part of which the Government omitted in its Reply Briefs: "An approved request for accommodation will remain in effect ... unless and until rescinded in accordance with the requirements of this issuance." As well as ¶3.2(g)(1): "(1) In accordance with this issuance ... an approved accommodation may be subject to review and rescission, in whole or in part, at any time, based upon a determination that the circumstances under which the grant of accommodation was approved have changed (e.g., deployment, new duties, or other material change in circumstances)." And finally, ¶3.2(h), permitting modification or suspension of religious accommodations for exigent circumstances.
