Nicholas Feronti declares under penalty of perjury:

1. I am an attorney with the Northern Justice Project, one of the firms

representing the named plaintiffs and plaintiff classes in the above-entitled action.

I am familiar with the facts and circumstances of this case. 2.

3. I make this declaration seeking the Court's permission to file a third

supplemental document containing newly acquired information that is relevant to the

Plaintiff's Renewed Motion for Preliminary Injunction, ECF No. 35.

4. On May 8, 2024, the plaintiffs filed their renewed motion for a preliminary

injunction. ECF 35. On June 12, 2024, the defendant opposed. ECF 46. On June 20, 2024,

the plaintiffs replied. ECF 52. On July 18, 2024, this Court held oral argument. ECF 59.

5. After oral argument, on August 22, 2024, the defendant produced new data

to the plaintiffs about the defendant's performance in timely processing SNAP applications

in June 2024 and July 2024. ECF 61-1 at 4. This new data indicated that the defendant's

rate of timely processing for non-expedited SNAP applications fell from 87% in May 2024

to 78% in July 2024, and that the defendant's timely processing rate for all initial SNAP

applications fell from 88% in May 2024 to 87% in July 2024. Id. at 8.

6. On August 23, 2024, the plaintiffs filed a motion to supplement their renewed

preliminary injunction filing with the data that the defendant produced the day before. ECF

61. On August 26, 2024, the defendant partially opposed this motion, arguing that the data

showed no "significant differences from the report already filed with Court," but still

stating that it did "not necessarily object" to the data entering the record. ECF 62 at 2.

7. On October 8, 2024, the plaintiffs made a second motion to supplement their

renewed preliminary injunction filing with newly acquired data that indicated that the

defendant's rate of timely processing for non-expedited SNAP applications dropped to

63%, and 67% for all applications, in September 2024. ECF No. 67-1 at 4. Moreover, at

the time of this filing, data indicated that the defendant had more than 3,000 backlogged

cases at the end of September. ECF No. 67-1 at 6. The defendant opposed this motion on

October 21, 2024, ECF No. 68, complaining again about the relevance of the data and the

scope of the injunction sought. The plaintiffs replied on October 23, 2024. ECF No. 69.

8. The plaintiffs now seek to further supplement the papers under consideration

in their renewed motion for preliminary injunction with newly available data that was

obtained on November 25, 2024, and which documents the defendant's ongoing failures in

the timely processing of SNAP applications and recertifications in the period since the last

supplemental data was filed. As previously referenced in the Plaintiffs' Second Motion to

Supplement, the plaintiffs persist in their belief that it is vital to keep the Court informed

about the defendant's current SNAP processing timeliness, and its backlog of SNAP

applications, in order to evaluate the necessity of the injunction sought. ECF No. 69 at 4.

9. The newly produced data provides further information about the defendant's

ongoing inability to meet timely processing standards. A pdf of the chart containing some

of this new data, which was produced as an Excel spreadsheet and marked as SOA 022846,

is attached hereto as Exhibit 1. This new data shows:

- The defendant's rate of timely processing for non-expedited SNAP applications was 87% in May 2024, 81% in June 2024, 78% in July 2024, 67% in August 2024, 63% in September 2024, and 70% in October 2024.
- The defendant's rate of timely processing for expedited SNAP applications was 89% in May 2024, 95% in June 2024, 94% in July 2024, 81% in August 2024, 74% in September 2024, and 75% in October 2024.
- The defendant's rate of timely processing for all initial SNAP applications was 88% in May 2024, 89% in June 2024, 87% in July 2024, 74% in August 2024, 67% in September 2024, and 72% in October 2024.
- 10. Additionally, attached as Exhibit 2 are tables titled "Backlog Applications / Recertifications," provided to the plaintiffs in PDF format as SOA 022847. This Backlog report identifies how long applications and recertifications for SNAP were pending, as of the date at the top of the table. This includes data for the weeks of September 26, 2024; October 3, 2024; October 17, 2024; October 31, 2024; November 7, 2024 and November 14, 2024. The data in Exhibit 2 picks up from the date last covered in the Plaintiffs' Second Motion to Supplement the Preliminary Injunction Filing. ECF NO. 67-1 at ¶ 10, Ex. 2.
- 11. The most recent of these Backlog reports, for November 14, 2024, indicates that, as of that date, there were 1,265 SNAP applications that were pending for more than 30 days and 2,271 recertifications pending for more than 30 days.
- 12. Attached as Exhibit 3 are tables titled "Average Age of Unacted Applications by Program," which report how many applications and recertifications for SNAP were pending beyond various times, as well as the average age that they were pending, all as of the date at the top of the table. The reports were produced to the plaintiffs in PDF format

as SOA 022847 for the following dates: October 21, 2024; October 28, 2024; November 4, 2024; and November 12, 2024.

13. The most recent of these aging reports indicates that the average time for aging, unprocessed non-expedited SNAP applications has now climbed to 64 days.

WHEREFORE, I respectfully request that the Court accept and review this additional data and proceed in determining the Plaintiffs' Renewed Motion for Preliminary Injunction that is now pending.
